The font was donated to Carlow College; document which lists placenames in County Carlow as taken from a map of the barony of Idrone dated circa 1570; transcription of memorial (13 June 1834) from Patrick McCaf[fey], accountant and storekeeper, Carlow District Lunatic Asylum, to Richard Wellesley, Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, in application for position of Superintendent of a new asylum at Clonmel, County Tipperary; transcription of notice published in the 'Leinster Journal' (23 September 1794) by Thomas Coffey advertising that he has equipped himself with a 'commodious carriage, stout horses & careful drivers' for public transportation; transcription of list of names of persons who claimed compensation for property lost during the 1798 Rebellion. Also sometimes given are address, position and amount awarded; transcription of letter (1808-1809) from Henry Hayden to the Honourable Wellesley Pole, Dublin Castle, informing him that he is a candidate for the position of Diocesan Master of Carlow School, vacant by the resignation of the Reverend Mr O'Callaghan; and transcriptions taken from Carlow Grand Jury Presentments (c early-mid 19th century).

It is believed that he purchased in trust with a view to the establishment of an industrial institution there; clipping from the 'Carlow Post' (11 March 1876) which quotes a report by the Inspector General of Prisons. Appears that the average cost of each prisoner in Carlow Gaol in 1874 was £69.8.0 and in Kildare it was £30.15.10. The Inspector General, in his report, stated that it would be a good thing that Carlow Gaol was amalgamated with Kildare or Kilkenny. Most of the clippings relate to persons imprisoned at Carlow. Clipping, possibly from a Kilkenny newspaper (no date) states that a Patrick Kavanagh was found guilty at Carlow assizes of collecting public tax without authority and was ordered to stand in the pillory for three months and be imprisoned for two months; report (c 9-12 September 1767) of attempted escape from the Gaol; report from the 'Carlow Sentinel' (17 February 1877) regarding proposed amalgamation of prisons. States that on average there are fifteen prisoners at Carlow with thirteen officials to mind them; report (2 February 1774) that Dawson Whitacre who was recently committed to the Gaol and was near effecting an escape, is now double bolted and neck-yoked; report from the 'Carlow Sentinel' (24 January 1846) of inspection of the Gaol by Major Palmer, Inspector-General of Prisons. He found the prisoners engaged in various 'industrious pursuits,' for example, weaving, shoemaking and tailoring.
