Sunday school held in the Chapel of Carlisle on each Sunday from nine to two o'clock. At which 508 females and 600 Males attend. They are taught by 89 females and 70 young men ~~who are~~ who with a few exceptions are members of a religious confraternity and well educated.

Of the children 1820 can read and all are taught the instruction in the truths and duties of religion. Besides Catechisms there is a parochial library to which the teachers can have access consisting of 280 volumes of religious books.

The above school has subsisted for the last thirty years but was reorganised in 1817.
