 is their long permanent - the disposition of the people - the
 talent in which any endeavors to induce such increase or
 diminishes have been successful or otherwise - general circumstances -

I have not known of any attempt being made to induce the Children attending the School to change their habits.
 There does not appear to be any permanent increase or diminution in the attendance of the Pupils within the
 last year. - Many of the children are kept at home from school, during the hours of the Spring & Harvest
 months - The want of good clothing operates very powerfully in preventing others from a regular
 Attendance at School. - The parents are almost universally anxious for the Education of their Children
 but their views are too often frustrated by the influence of the causes just mentioned - To induce them
 to attend the School I have left no means untried; and I do believe the full attendance of pupils is, in
 a great measure, owing to my exertions. - So long as the School has my support, the attendance of the
 Children will be regular and permanent - I trust it of that day, and my belief is, that it will never
 in a very short time cease to exist. - The Disposition of that Part of my System of Education, which
 puts the sacred Scriptures into the hands of children, ~~in my view, and in every other view, is~~
~~the most important measure, and~~ and believing as I most deeply do that it
 has rendered the progress of Education in Ireland, I feel most deeply, fully to School, the a kind of
 of the "Gospel of Education" I give the following observations: I respond with the reading of the sacred
 Scriptures in the School, and to present lectures which would convey to the minds of the Children a more correct
 the minds of the People to supply their place; to have the right of appointment duly granted Masters, and to

 to the benefits of Education, and had they been acted upon at an earlier period, it is my firm belief
 that Education would long since have found its way to the remotest corner of the Kingdom, and the time
 of His Majesty's Commissioners would not now be consumed in endeavoring to ascertain the state of
 Education, and in enquiring into the causes which have retarded its progress, in Ireland.
